2. Pre-transition event



We organized a farewell event to celebrate the completion of our accelerated learning project in Rugga and the transitioning of the children in formal schools! The event was graced by several parastatals like UBEC and CSOs as well as the community members including the community leader. We had a series of interesting performances from our beneficiaries.

3. Workshop on school related gender based violence (SRGBV)



We facilitated a workshop in partnership with the Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) on school related gender based violence (SRGBV), for staff of State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB) from Ebonyi, Imo, Enugu, Lagos, Osun, Ogun and Oyo states. The workshop was organized by the UBEC's Better Education Service Delivery for All (BESDA) project funded by the World Bank.

4. ABEP workshop



On Policy formulation: We attended a 5- day workshop organized by Nigerian Educational Research and Development Council (NERDC) in partnership with Plan International where the team contributed to the development of the national guidelines for implementation of accelerated basic education program (ABEP) in Nigeria.

5. AccLearn beneficiaries' enrollment



34 of our beneficiaries from the AccLearn program were mainstreamed into formal school and many fit comfortably into primary 4!

The unique structure of the AccLearn program has three pathways of which one among them is mainstreaming the children into formal schools. We are very proud of this achievement and look forward to many fruitful partnerships reducing the number of out-of-school children through the AccLearn program.

6. Community search for Acclearn!



In our search for communities with a high need for educational interventions like our unique AccLearn program, we came across and engaged a community in Abuja named Unguwar Guragu (the disabled colony) where ninety percent of community stakeholders are people with disabilities. Their wards will now be provided with a flexible platform to access quality education through the program.



7. Visit to REA



We paid a visit to the Rural Electrification Agency Nigeria (REA) and met with the MD, Engr Ahmad Salihijo Ahmad and the ED, Rural Electrification Fund, Dr Sanusi Ohiare. We reminded the REA leadership on their commitment to provide solar powering systems to support our mobile classroom project (keying into REA's mandate of improving the quality of life and economic opportunities for unserved and underserved communities).

This collaboration between FlexiSAF Foundation and the REA contributes to five Sustainable Development Goals.

8. Enrollment process for back to school in Yola:



Upto 40 out of school children in Yola got the opportunity to pursue their dreams through our sponsorship program. With only N4170/month you can give a child the future of their dreams.

9. ABEP Teachers' pilot training in Maiduguri:



Our programs assistant, Ms. Amina Usman represented the team in Maiduguri to participate in a 5-day ABEP pilot training for teachers.

10. Sponsors' week:

As part of our back to school program, we organized online sessions where more than 10 of our sponsors got to meet and interact with their beneficiaries in different parts of Nigeria!



11. Rewarding beneficiaries with 90% attendance:



As part of our efforts to avoid drop out and encourage retention in schools, we organized a little award ceremony to reward our beneficiaries with an attendance of 90% and above! Items such as school bags, books and writing materials were presented to the children with the highest attendance.
