BESDA training in Oyo, Ibadan

We were invited to facilitate a step-down training on the DLI.7 Digital attendance app in Oyo state. The team, represented by the Program Manager, Mr. Nelson Egbunu visited the Oyo state's State Universal Basic Education Board (SUBEB) where they met with the Executive Secretary, Mr. O. J. Adeniyi and Chairman SUBEB Oyo Dr. Nureni Aderemi Adeniran to discuss and draw up an itinerary on the cascading training for states, LGAs, Head teachers and SBMCs.



BESDA DLI App master training in Lagos

FlexiSAF Foundation was invited by Universal Basic Education Commission (UBEC) for a 5-day (10th-14th May 2022) training of Master Trainers on the Disbursement Link Indicator (DLI.7) Guidelines For Utilization of School Grant/Supports in BESDA (Better Education Service Delivery for All) focus states held at Ikeja, Lagos state. The training involved an overview of DLI.7 which is a digital attendance intervention to bolster attendance and renting in public schools, and a description of the ICT-based BESDA Attendance Management Information System (BAMIS) tool, which is an app that will help with monitoring both students' attendance and teacher coaching.


Invitation to the workshop on the development of draft re-entry guidelines for girls as resource persons

Our Executive Director got invited by the Federal Ministry of Education to support the development of girls' re-entry guidelines into learning centers as a national resource person alongside resource persons from UNICEF Nigeria and UN Women Nigeria. Focus group discussions were organized amongst relevant stakeholders at the community level to analyze the need to build and maintain a system that supports girls to re-enroll in school, remain, and transit to higher levels of education.



FlexiSAF Foundation Joins The Inter-Agency Accelerated Education Working Group

FlexiSAF Foundation has been recognized as a credible member of the National Working Group for the Accelerated Basic Education Program (ABEP). The Working Group has in its membership notable international organizations, representatives from Ministries, Departments, and Agencies of Government amongst all other stakeholders in the country's education sector. The outcome of the Inter-Agency Accelerated Education Working Group will see the Foundation play an active role in the Accelerated Education Task team, a team that will drive the core implementation of the ABEP countrywide.





ABEP Roll-Out

As members of the ABEP National Working Group, we got invited to participate in the National Roll Out of ABEP. The event was chaired by the honourable minister of education and hosted by NERDC with support from the Plan International-led consortium, funded by the EU. Many relevant stakeholders from International and National CSOs, Government agencies as well as the private sector graced the event.



Meeting with Governors' Forum

The Nigeria Governors' Forum Secretariat, represented by Dr. Leo, hosted a community of practice for strategic discussions on how best to effectively institutionalise the Accelerated Basic Education Programme (ABEP) curriculum within states in Nigeria. We were invited to participate in the meeting as part of the Nationally recognized members of the ABEP Working Group.

Teachers' Needs Assessment Abuja

We conducted a needs assessment exercise for teachers in 3 different schools in Abuja, LEA Wuye, LEA Wuse Zone 1, and LEA Wuse Zone 2. The exercise is to be implemented across different states, which include Abuja, Adamawa, and Kano and we will be assessing 1000 teachers by the end of 2022. The needs assessment aims to help identify common strengths and weaknesses among teachers and to provide feedback and necessary interventions for improvement.



Interview with VOA Africa



Teachers' Needs Assessment Yola

We conducted a needs assessment exercise in Adamawa state across 20 schools in Yola South and Yola North Local Government Areas. It was a seamless process due to the involvement of Adamawa SUBEB, and the schools and teachers were very cooperative which enabled us to interview no less than 200 teachers in 3 days.



Intensive Leadership Program in the USA

Our Executive Director, Amina Abubakar participated In an intensive leadership and cultural exchange program; the Alumni Enrichment Institute, sponsored by the United States Bureau for Cultural affairs. The Alumni Enrichment Institute is a program that provides an opportunity for Mandela Washington Fellowship Alumni to travel to the United States to collaborate with U.S. counterparts and each other and to continue building the professional and leadership skills they developed during their Leadership Institutes. The participants also enrich their U.S. host communities through public service, cultural exchange, and the lasting personal ties they create during their program.



She interacted with distinguished personalities like congresswoman Karen Bass, Mayors of Counties, and Top US professionals and is still enjoying the coaching and mentorship she gets as a result of the program. We're super excited about this experience and look forward to productive collaborations with her fellow alumni across Africa.



World Humanitarian Day 2022

To commemorate World Humanitarian Day 2022, FlexiSAF Foundation extended a hand of fellowship to the parents and guardians of the Acclearn (Accelerated Learning) beneficiaries by supporting them with food items. We also facilitated the installation of 5 solar street lights and 24 solar home systems in the disabled colony by the Nigeria Rural Electrification Agency (REA). 15 of the Acclearn (Accelerated Learning) children were selected to be beneficiaries of the Solar home system intervention from REA based on their attendance and performance.




Youth Arise Football Academy (YAFA) Scholarship

We also presented a cash prize of 400,000 Naira to the academy which was awarded by the Captain of the Super Eagles, Ahmed Musa. Education in Emergencies Working Group in Nigeria (EiEWGN) Monthly Meeting

We had a productive session at the Education in Emergencies Working Group in Nigeria (EiEWGN) monthly meeting at the Federal Ministry of Education chaired by the Director of Education Support Services, Dr. Lydia Ifeyinwa. Members gave updates on various interventions, challenges, and upcoming plans specifically in North Eastern Nigeria. We also bid farewell to a strong backbone of the working group, Dr. Judith from Unicef, who has so much goodwill in the group.



Safeguarding Our Schools Conference

We were at the SOS (Safeguarding Our Schools) event organized by Emergency Communications Centres (ECC) and sponsored by UNICEF. The event was a high-level meeting that had the Ambassadors of Norway, the United States, and some other countries. The School Principals of GSS Chibok, GSSS Kankara, and GGSS Jangebe were present to speak about their experience of the insurgency. The event also had the Minister of Finance, the representatives of the Chief of Army Staff and the Chief of Naval Staff present, and finally the Chairman of the Nigerian Governors Forum present. The event was insightful and very impactful as the team learned firsthand the community stigma that victims of insurgent attacks face. The school principals held a panel session where they related with the audience and took questions.



Accelerated Education Program Task Team Workshop

We were invited to participate in a 3-day workshop titled the Nigeria Accelerated Education Program Task Team workshop. The workshop is to formally inaugurate the Nigeria Accelerated Education (AE) Task Team and get them acquainted with the Accelerating Change for Children's and Youths' Education for System Strengthening (ACCESS) research and their roles in ACCESS Phase 2. The ACCESS is a 4-year research partnership between the University of Auckland, the global Accelerated Education Working Group (AEWG), and Dubai Cares. The overall outcome of the workshop is to develop a world plan to guide the activities of the AE Task Team and facilitate the Institutionalization of the ABEP in Nigeria.



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
