

Spelling Bee Competition








Enrollment of 10 beneficiaries into school in Zamfara State

FlexiSAF Foundation End of Quarter Review Meeting







Sulaiman's life has been marked by tragedy from a young age. His father was taken from him in a brutal act of violence that shook their community to its core. It has been two long years since that day, but the pain and sorrow still linger for Sulaiman and his family.

His mother, Shafa'atu, has been doing her best, as a local food vendor, to provide for her six children. Despite her tireless efforts, it has been a struggle to make ends meet, and Sulaiman's sisters have had to help out by selling food on the streets.

However, the challenges have been many, and with only little help from society. Hence, Shafa'atu has been unable to enroll all of her children in school. Sulaiman, in particular, has never had the chance to attend school, except for a brief period at an Arabic school.

So you can imagine the joy and excitement that filled Sulaiman's heart when he received the news that he would be enrolled in school by the FlexiSaf Foundation. It was like a ray of hope in an otherwise bleak world.

Sulaiman's dream is to become a land Army officer, and with this opportunity, he feels like he's one step closer to making that dream a reality. He is determined to work hard, to study diligently, and to never let the memory of his father fade away.

For Sulaiman, education is not just a means to an end. It is a way to honor his father, to build a brighter future for his family, and to contribute to his community. Monitoring and Evaluation Tools Session at the National Senior Secondary Education Commission (NSSEC)





We were at the National Senior Secondary Education Commission (NSSEC) for a workshop to review and amend the monitoring tool using the National School-based Management Policy.

The workshop had the Executive Secretary of the NSSEC, the Director of Basic Education, FlexiSAF Foundation staff as resource persons, and Deputy Directors, Assistant Directors from the Federal Ministry of Education. Participants discussed the importance of School-Based Management Committees (SBMCs) and the need to review the tool. The review session was led by our Executive Director, Mrs. Amina Abubakar, who highlighted the objectives and core values of the SBMC and how it is important for the tool to capture and address them.

School Based Management Committee (SBMC) is a structure developed to improve the quality of outcomes from public school through community ownership and involvement in important issues. The SBM system is expected to assist in developing plans and monitoring of school activities through active supervision of school activities and developing partnerships.

Success Story Elevating the Girl Child through Education — the Story of Maryam



Maryam is one of the FlexiSAF Foundation's beneficiaries who was enrolled in Primary One in Wisdom International School (now Sonesis International School) during the 2019 session. Prior to the Foundation's intervention, she was categorized as an out-of-school child, as her father, who was a driver at the time, could not afford to do so. At the beginning, Maryam was not particularly successful at the beginning because of her poor educational background. She found it very difficult to adjust as she could barely communicate in English. Thanks to the Foundation's rigorous mentoring policy where we interface with both teachers and students alike, a special attention was given to Maryam to help her catch up with the rest of the students.

Fast forward to when Maryam was in Primary 4 (2021/2022 session), her quest for excellence knew no bounds as she was found to be very inquisitive and attentive in class. By the end of the first term, she came 10th in a class of 40 students. Astonishingly, for Maryam, the battle has just started. At the end of the second term, she improved with a commendable 4th position in a class of 40 students.

It was at this junction that the foundation took a keen interest in young Maryam. A visit was scheduled to commend her parents on their unflinching support towards Maryam's education.

The journey of Maryam's success story was finally cemented when she finally excelled at the third term examination with an excellent result – she came 3rd in a class of 33 students. This heroic and outstanding performance of Maryam warranted her teacher to nominate her for the Final School Common Entrance Exam in 2022. To everyone's amazement, Maryam was among the six successful candidates who passed the exam.

She was successfully enrolled in Sonesis Secondary School last September for the 2022/2023 session. During her first year, she was greeted with a different challenge of acclimatizing with her new environment as different sets of students from various schools are now her classmates. However, with Maryam, it is not yet the climax as she excelled with a remarkable result. She came 2nd in a class of 22 students. It is no doubt that little Maryam means business and her recent exploits have left no one in doubt that it is only a matter of time until she tops her class. The story of Maryam is surely an indicator that a lot of young girls, when given the opportunity, have a lot to offer. At FlexiSAF Foundation, we thrive to ensure that children like Maryam are given a chance to learn and reach their full potential.

International Day of Education: partnership with Sahel Consulting to enroll 20 out-of-school children back to school





We celebrated the International Day of Education with an enrollment event to send 20 out-of-school children back to school.

The event, which was organized in partnership with Sahel Consulting Agriculture and Nutrition Limited, is under the Foundation's Sustainable Education Program (SEP).

SEP promotes the concept of sustainability and empowers parents through climate-friendly initiatives, including climate-friendly agriculture, recycling, up-cycling, and other sustainable projects. At the end of the event, 20 out-of-school children were identified and 12 of them were successfully enrolled 12 into LEA Kado Bimko Primary School, Abuja.



Visit to Kwali







Staying true to its mission to improve access to quality education for indigent children in Nigeria through innovative projects, the FlexiS-AF Foundation visited 4 rural communities in Kwali, a local government aread under Gwagwalada Area Council of the Federal Capital Territory.

These communities, namely Kilankwa 1, Kilankwa 2, Petti, and Old Chukuku, are known for having a high number of vulnerable households and Out-of-School Children (OOSC).

The Foundation team identified lack of funds, lack of sensitization, and lack of proximity to schools, as the main reasons for the alarming rate of OOSC in these communities.

The FlexiSAF Foundation plans to extend its reach to these communities and give the children of these communities the opportunity to reach their full potential through quality education.

Left-handed by Circumstance


- The Story of Abbas.
