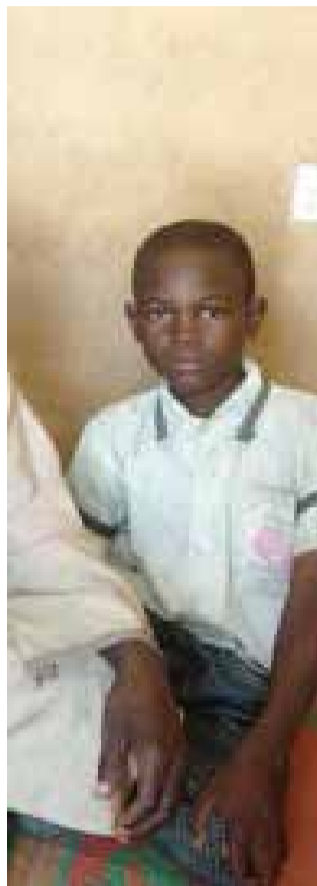

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Beneficiary story - The Audacity of Hope: The Journey of Yusuf Muhammad



Once upon a time in Yobe State, there lived a young boy named Muhammad Yusuf. At the tender age of 11, he found himself fortunate to be a part of the Flexisaf Foundation's Scholarship Scheme. Hailing from Jakusko LGA, Yusuf, after the demise of his father, was sent to Tudun Murtala in Kano State to attend a traditional Qur'anic school.

Initially, Yusuf was not included in the list of potential beneficiaries of the scheme. However, fate intervened, and on a Sunday, the 14th of October 2018, as I set out to verify the list of 24 children provided by the Ward Head of Unguwar Gabas, Mallam Saleh Mai Fata, I unexpectedly visited the house of Mallam Abubakar, whose child was on the list. Upon observing the house, an inner voice urged me to question whether a child from such a house could truly be without schooling.

After exchanging pleasantries with Mallam Abubakar, I introduced myself and explained the purpose of my visit, shedding light on my organization and its activities. During our conversation, I discovered that his ward was already attending school, and therefore, there was no need to enroll him in our program.

It was at that moment that I noticed little Yusuf emerging from Mallam Abubakar's house, carrying a bucket of water on his head. I called out to him and inquired about his name. "Yusuf is my name," he replied. Instantly, my mind began contemplating enrolling him in our program, but I knew there were hurdles to overcome due to his "almajiri status." Many promising "almajiri" children had missed out on the opportunity of receiving a Western education due to the reluctance of their traditional Qur'anic teachers, known as "Alarammas," to grant permission. With this in mind, I decided to meet with Yusuf's Quranic teacher, Alaramma Sani Abdullahi.

A week later, I met Alaramma Mallam Sani at his school, where he was busy teaching numerous children simultaneously. We found a nearby shade to sit, and I introduced myself and explained the objectives of my organization. After exchanging pleasantries, I shared my desire to see Yusuf enrolled in school and inquired about his background.

To my surprise, Alaramma Mallam Sani was not only well-versed but also highly knowledgeable. He explained, "Yusuf is under my sole custodianship, and I will gladly enroll him in any school of your choice. Lack of sponsorship is the main hindrance faced by many children here in Tudun Murtala. I currently have close to 80 students, including a graduate with an NCE certificate and secondary school graduates. Times have changed, and I have never discouraged any of my students from seeking a Western education."

Alaramma Mallam Sani's words resonated with me. He acknowledged that the issue of out-of-school children was a pressing concern in Tudun Murtala, a densely populated area in the heart of Kano metropolis. He further explained that many Alarammas were hesitant to partner with NGOs and civil societies due to the lack of a clear purpose.

Time flew, and in September 2018, little Yusuf was enrolled in Primary One at Wisdom International School in Tudun Murtala. With the guidance of his Qur'anic teacher, Alaramma Mallam Sani, Yusuf proved to be a diligent and punctual student. His teachers quickly noticed his academic prowess, attributed to his inquisitive nature and photographic memory. Everything Yusuf learned had to be memorized, just like his Qur'anic verses. For a child who had never attended school before, securing the 18th position out of 45 students in his first-term examination was truly remarkable. However, Yusuf was just getting started.

During his second-term examination, Yusuf astounded everyone with his performance, securing the 4th position. It became evident to his teachers and classmates that it was only a matter of time before Yusuf would top his class. As the School Principal aptly put it, "His performance has put to rest any doubts surrounding his almajiri background." By the end of the third term, everyone eagerly anticipated Yusuf's results, and once again, he achieved an impressive 2nd position in a class of 35 students.

During the school's annual Speech and Prize-giving Day, the crowd erupted with joy when Yusuf's name was called to collect his prize. His story as an Almajiri boy with no prior exposure to Western education had become known throughout the school. His teachers, Alaramma Malam Sani, and his employer, Mallam Abubakar, joined in celebrating his remarkable achievements. Little Yusuf was truly living his dream of attending school, and when asked about his aspirations for the future, he confidently answered, "I want to become a doctor."

In my interview session with Malam Saleh Mai Fata, the Ward Head of Unguwar Gabas in Tudun Murtala, I shared the latest developments in his community, including Yusuf's progress. Malam Saleh expressed his concern about the alarming number of out-of-school children in their community. He acknowledged that despite the government's efforts, their densely populated area was still educationally underserved. He emphasized the importance of civil societies and NGOs contributing their share to address this issue. Malam Saleh recounted previous encounters with other NGOs who had come to partner on out-of-school children but had not followed through.

The story of Yusuf Muhammad is a testament to the audacity of hope and the transformative power of education. Through the collaboration between the FlexiSAF Foundation, Alaramma Mallam Sani, and the determination of Yusuf himself, an Almajiri boy overcame barriers to access education and showcased his remarkable capabilities. His journey serves as an inspiration for others and highlights the significance of collective efforts in ensuring every child's right to education.

Gender and Education Parity Advocacy Project (GEPAP) Stakeholder Workshop



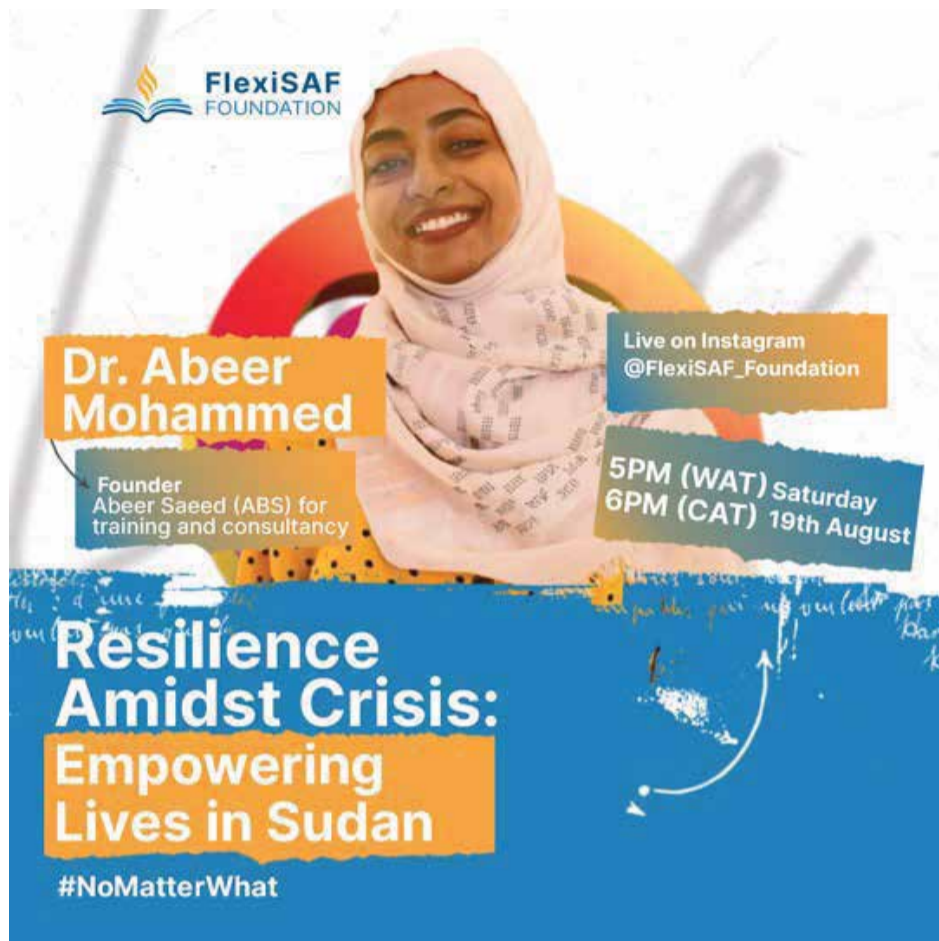

Despite earning a meager monthly salary, her mother's dedication and connection to the school kept Asma'u's education afloat.

However, despite the efforts, circumstances took a turn recently. Unable to meet the financial demands, Asma'u had to face the unfortunate reality of dropping out of school. The financial strain proved to be overwhelming, and her family reached a point where sustaining her education was no longer feasible.

Asma'u's father is a retired Gatekeeper who finds himself without a current source of employment. The challenges the family faces, coupled with the economic pressures, created a complex situation that led to this difficult decision.

While Asma'u's educational journey hit a temporary pause, the FlexiSAF Foundation, recognizing the potential in her determination, was able to enroll her in school through the Foundation's sponsorship program. The sponsorship program is the conventional back-to-school program where a good Samaritan supports a child or children get quality education through the Foundation. With this newfound support, Asma'u was able to reclaim her spot in school, defying the odds that had once threatened her journey.

The FlexiSAF Foundation continues to strive to make quality education accessible, ensuring that beneficiaries like Asma'u can overcome obstacles and pursue their dreams in the face of adversity.



National Digital Literacy Framework Launch



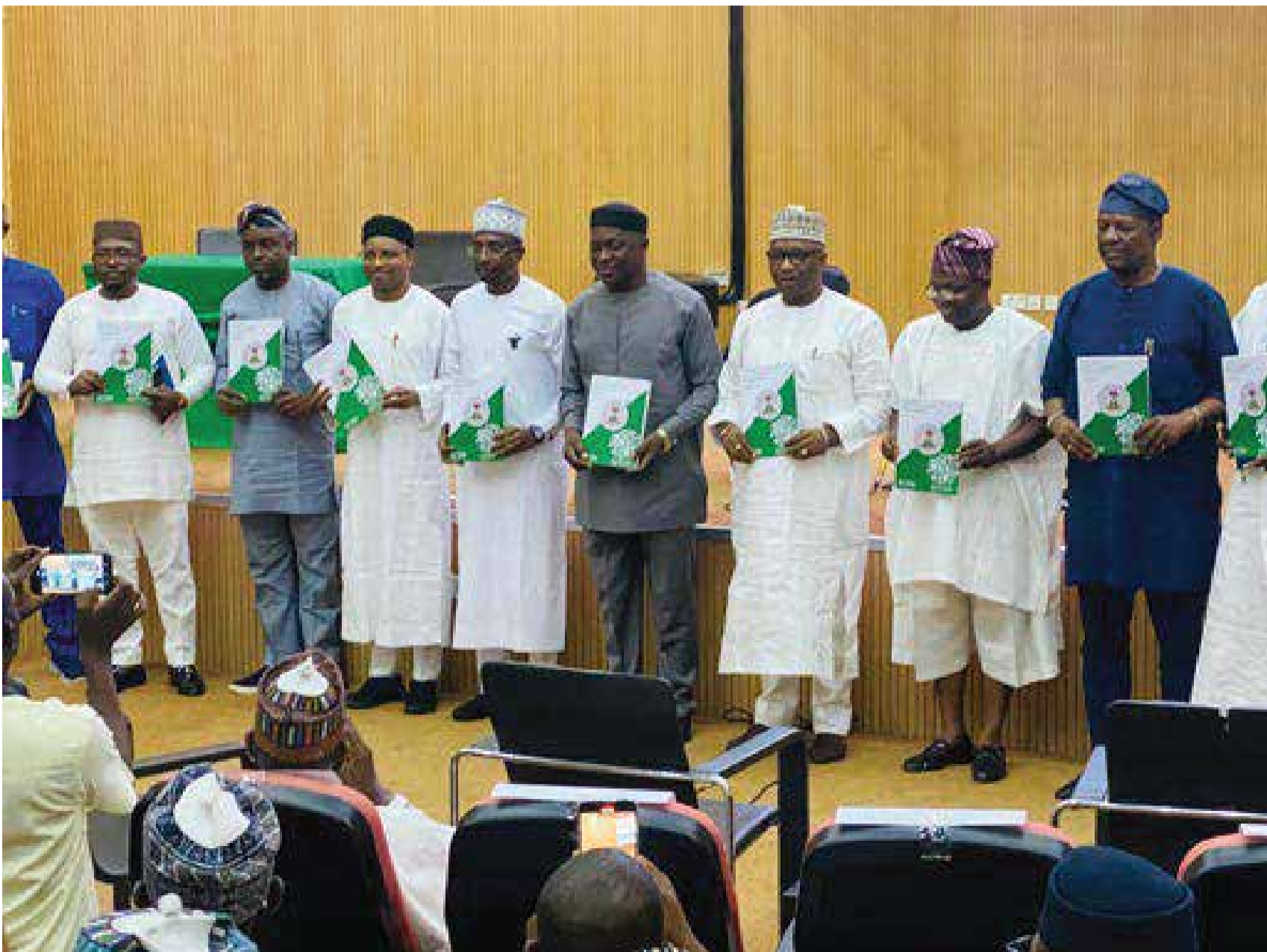
We were invited to the launch of the National Digital Literacy Framework by the National Information Technology Development Agency (NITDA) Nigeria.

Seminar on the Nigeria Learning Platform (NLP)

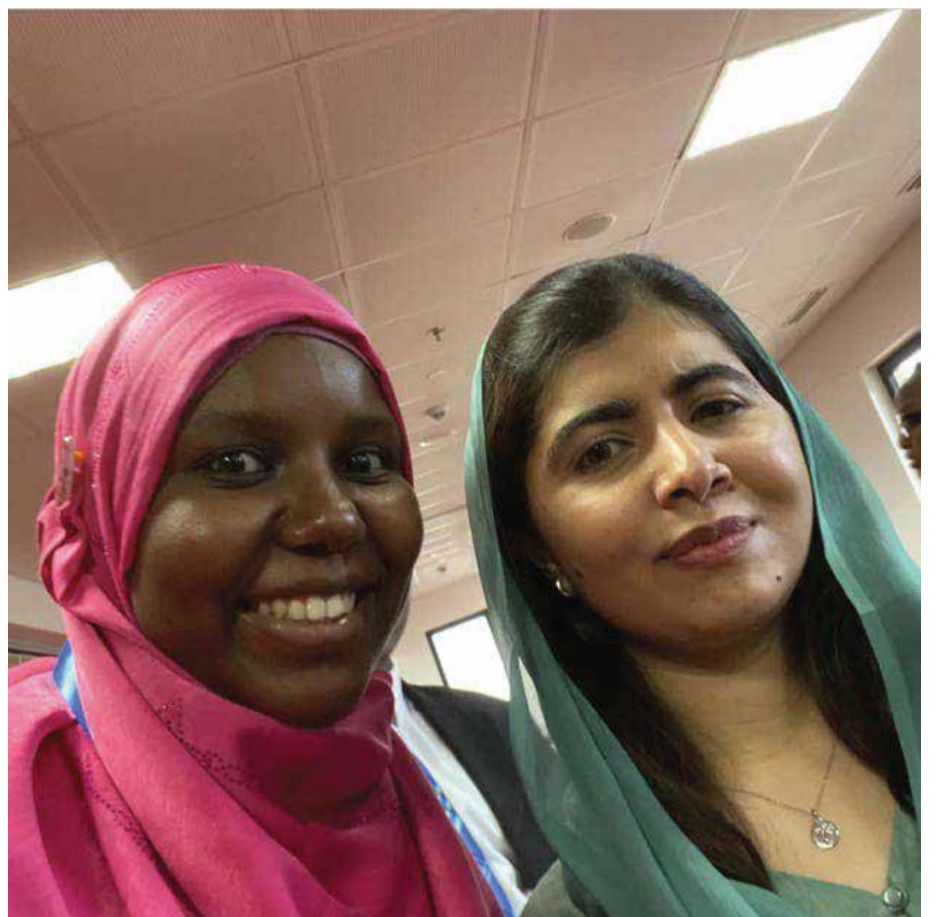
