Young Mansir was a pupil at a Primary School in Mai Addua Local Government Area of Katsina State. He suffered from measles at infancy, which left his two hands paralyzed. However, this misfortune did not deter him from his quest to obtain Education. Mansir perfected the art of using his legs to write. Unfortunately, his dream was threatened by the poor circumstances of his parents who are subsistence farmers in a remote area.

It was at this juncture that the National Commission for Nomadic Education (NCNE) contacted FlexiSAF Foundation to intervene and ensure that Mansir's dream of furthering his education is kept alive. The Foundation immediately rose to the occasion by sending a volunteer to assess the situation. After much interaction with Mansir's community of Tsohon Birni, his school teachers and many more, it was realized that Mansir is indeed passionate about schooling despite living with disability. He was confirmed to be punctual and attentive in his school.

The challenge then was to find a suitable secondary school that would be close to Mansir's village, and unfortunately, there was none. To access the closest secondary school to him, Mansir had to cross a busy highway to trek down to an adjacent village. After much deliberation, a school (Alheri Nursery, Primary and Secondary School) not so far from Mansir's village was identified for him to be enrolled. Luckily, his grandparents reside in the vicinity. The joy and happiness of Mansir knew no bounds as he readily agreed to relocate to his grandparents' in order to start schooling again.

Fast forward to today, Mansir is now a JSS 2 student of Alheri Nursery, Primary and has been labeled by his principal as a model child who is hard working and always punctual to school. His dream of furthering his education is now a reality thanks to the Foundation's unwavering and decisive action.

As we celebrate Mansir's triumph, let his story be a call to action. Together, let's strive for a society that embraces inclusivity and accessibility for every individual, regardless of their abilities.

In the heart of Abuja, within the close-knit community of Kado Bimko, nine-year-old Habiba Abdulaziz found herself grappling with the harsh reality of limited access to education.

Habiba was born into a below-average family. She lost her mom a few years ago and has been under the custody of her grandmother, Asma'u, who is battling illness and currently unable to provide for the family. One of her daughters, Habiba's aunt, prepares and sells food in the community to help support the family. However, things have been hard.

In their pursuit of a better life, the family had to relocate. The road to their new home is narrow and dilapidated, a reflection of the challenges they faced. Financially challenged and unable to fund Habiba's education, Habiba's academic journey hit an abrupt halt, making her a dropout. Nevertheless, her innate interest in education persisted, and her dream of becoming a doctor shone brightly in the midst of challenges.

Fortunately, early last year, FlexiSAF Foundation, through its valued partnership with Sahel Consulting, identified Habiba and her need for the foundation's intervention. Thanks to the partnership with Sahel Consulting, the foundation was able to enroll Habiba back to school under its Sustainable Education Program — an innovative initiative that allows families to sustain their children's education through recyclable waste collection. To convert these recyclables into funds, the foundation partners with recycling companies that pay for the collected materials. Returning to the classroom, Habiba faced challenges in communicating in English. Primarily using Hausa, she struggled to understand her teachers and peers. She also expressed to the foundation team her distress over the overcrowded classroom and scarcity of chairs, which compounded her difficulties and deprived her of a smooth learning experience.

Despite these obstacles, Habiba's journey with the Sustainable Education Program yielded great results, acting as the bridge that connected her to a new chapter in her life. With dedication and support, she not only coped with her initial difficulties but excelled. Her good behavior, respectful demeanor, and diligence in copying notes were testaments to her resilience. She was also a quick learner, and hence, the foundation ensured she received extra attention to help her excel in her studies.

The impact of the foundation's intervention extended beyond the classroom. As Asma'u, Habiba's grandmother, emotionally expressed her gratitude, she prayed for continuous blessings upon the foundation. The emotional depth of her words underscored the profound impact of its efforts. In a touching moment,

Habiba herself shared a heartfelt message: "Tell the foundation I want to become a medical doctor. Thank you for giving me a chance." Her words resonated with the essence of FlexiS-AF Foundation's mission – not merely providing education but also nurturing dreams.

Habiba's story is one of triumph over adversity, a testament to the power of education and the unwavering support provided by FlexiSAF Foundation. Through the Sustainable Education Program, the foundation has not only opened doors to learning but has also sown the seeds of ambition in a young girl's heart, paving the way for a future where dreams can blossom against all odds.

Project Educate All: Project Activities Officially Kicked Off at the Durumi IDP Camp, Abuja



We are excited to have successfully initiated project activities at the Durumi IDP camp, Abuja, for Project Educate All, in partnership with the National Commission for Refugees, Migrants, and Internally Displaced Persons (NCFRMI). With a focus on improving the lives of People of Concern (PoCs), particularly 1,200 children in the FCT and Niger state over three years, the project aims to provide accelerated education and climate education to these vulnerable groups.

Our team engaged the Durumi IDP community to enlighten them about the project, its criteria and expected outcomes, and collected the bio-data of selected PoCs after obtaining their consent. Verification of their background and stories was also conducted, followed by a baseline assessment/placement test to determine their levels for program enrollment.

We eagerly look forward to the next steps, where we will recruit supervisors and instructors, with the anticipation of starting the learning sessions soon. The project is poised to make a positive impact on the lives of PoCs in the community.



Beneficiary Feature: "From Rugga to Resilience: Fatima's Soaring Education Journey."





Meet Fatima Nasir, a resilient soul hailing from the humble village of Rugga in Wuye, Abuja, Nigeria. In 2019, the FlexiSAF Foundation, a non-governmental organization born out of a commitment to tackle the alarming rates of out-of-school children and illiteracy in Nigeria, identified her in the depths of poverty, marking the beginning of her transformative journey through the foundation's flagship initiative, the Accelerated Learning Program (AccLearn). Fatima, initially completely out of school and having no experience of formal education, found herself immersed in the AccLearn program, a community-based alternative education initiative designed to equip out-of-school children for integration into the formal schooling system within a remarkably short span of 12 to 36 months.

From day one, Fatima exhibited an unwavering commitment to learning. She had remarkable attendance, earning her the Best Attendance award during the pilot AccLearn Program Pre-transition event in 2021. Her dedication paid off when, after just 18 months of learning in Rugga, she seamlessly transitioned into primary 4 in a formal conventional school, emerging among the top 5 students in her class—an extraordinary feat for someone experiencing formal education for the first time.

Fast forward to the present, Fatima is on the cusp of another milestone—preparing to write her common entrance examination in April 2024, to secure admission into junior secondary school. Her progress is not just academic; she has mastered English and even addressed the press during the foundation's maiden Walk for Education, an annual fundraising fitness and advocacy event, which happened in 2021.

What makes Fatima's journey extraordinary is not just her academic triumphs but the resilience she displayed every step of the way. Picture her first day, stepping into the world of learning, a world she had never known before. Witness her receiving the Best Attendance award during the pilot AccLearn pre-transition event—a recognition not just of her attendance but of her determination, her unyielding spirit against the odds. After 18 months of relentless learning in Rugga, Fatima transcended barriers and seamlessly integrated into primary 4 in a formal conventional school. Picture the joy, the pride, and the sense of accomplishment as she emerged among the top 5 students in her class—a feat almost unbelievable for someone who had not experienced formal education until just some months ago.

Indeed, Fatima's story is a testament to the impact of FlexiSAF Foundation, tirelessly working to change the narrative for out-of-school children in Nigeria. Her story is the story of many other children in the country; countless others like her who are waiting for an opportunity.
