#### Revive to Live Campaign - A Tree Planting Initiative










We were at LEA Primary School Wuye where we planted 20 trees as part of our "Revive to Live" campaign under our Sustainable Education Program (SEP).


Amina Usman remarked, "We are deeply honored by this recognition. It fuels our commitment to continue providing vital educational resources and opportunities to children who need it the most."

### Important Update: School Fees Adjustment for the Next Academic Session



We extend our heartfelt gratitude to all our sponsors for their invaluable support throughout this academic session, which has positively impacted the lives of our beneficiaries.

As we conclude this session, we would like to inform everyone of an important update regarding school fees. Due to the country's current economic situation and rising operational costs, we are increasing the annual school fees from 60,000 naira to 72,000 naira; and the monthly fees from 5,000 naira to 6,000 naira, effective next session. This adjustment is essential to maintain and enhance the quality of education and services we offer to our beneficiaries.

We understand this may require some adjustments on the part of our sponsors. Please be assured this decision was made after careful consideration. We deeply appreciate the continued support and understanding of our sponsors and we look forward to their continued partnership in the coming session.



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
